Specification of introductory courses with prerequisites:			Students should demonstrate a basic knowledge of the USA and the UK and an interest in the history of these countries. This knowledge is the starting point for extended and systematic assimilation of the subject content.						

Educational goal: The main aim of the course is for students to acquire a body of historical knowledge about the US and the UK, as well as to understand the most important documents related to landmarks of the historical process. Learning outcomes (course-related): Student:

- has knowledge of the history of the British Isles and the United States from the earliest to the latest times; he knows the most important events in the history of Great Britain and the USA and is able to relate them to general history K W01;
- has elementary knowledge of the countries of the English language area K_W02;
- has elementary knowledge of contemporary cultural and social life of the countries of English language area K W08;
- has a structured knowledge of selected political, economic, social, cultural and cultural aspects of the countries of the English language area, as well as knowledge of their relations with other regions and countries K W09.

- is able to search for necessary information and use it; is able to prepare written works and oral speeches on a given subject K U06;
- is able to independently acquire knowledge, plan and develop their skills and competences in the field of culture of the English-speaking area K_U10.


