Within the K U05 framework of conversation, selected lexical K U06 K U07 ranges are introduced and students are K U08 familiarized with the codes of verbal K U10 behavior specific to the countries of the K U11 K U13 English language area. They develop linguistic communication skills by Social expressing and justifying their own competences: K K01 opinions, responding spontaneously and K K02 engaging in conversation on a wide range of K K06 topics, as well as the ability to hold K_K07 discussions, participate in debates and deliver speeches. Methods of conducting Explanation of theory by the lecturer, exercises performed by students in classes: class under the supervision of the lecturer, and independent work by students at home: performing additional exercises, consolidating and expanding theoretical knowledge on their own.
